Bine Ati Venit Rapid

Unul din aspectele cele mai fascinante ale competițiilor europene este cuplarea cluburilor cu renume mondial care nu s-au mai întilnit niciodată în trecut.

De la începutul sezonului prezent de fotbal, în turele anterioare ale Cupei Uniunii Asociațiilor Europene de Fotbal, echipa Spurs a jucat și înfrînt deja echipa islandeză Keflavik și echipa franceză Nantes, cluburi împotriva cărora nu am avut prilejul să evoluăm niciodată în trecut.

In primul tur, Rapid a înfrint echipa italiană Napoli, iar echipa Legia din Varșovia a fost victima ei în turul următor.

Adresăm un bine-ați venit călduros și suporterilor echipei Rapid. Oricare va fi rezultatul acestui meci, sperăm că ei vor fi fost răsplătiți pentru lungul lor voiaj cu o performanță memorabilă de fotbal de mare calitate.

Welcome to Rapid

One of the great fascinations of European competition is the pairing of clubs of world renown, who have never previously met.

Already this season in the earlier rounds of the U.E.F.A.—Union of European Football Associations—Cup, Spurs have played and defeated Keflavik of Iceland, and Nantes of France, clubs against whom we had never in the past been called upon to pit our strength.

The pattern continues in the Third Round this evening, when we play the first leg of our tie with Rapid Bucarest, who have made the long journey from Rumania.

To the officials and players of Rapid, we extend a cordial and sporting welcome to White Hart Lane. We hope they will return home with happy memories of their visit to London, although we need hardly say that it is vitally important to us that the result of tonight's match should give us a position of strength in preparation for the second leg in Bucharest on Wednesday, 15th December.

Spurs had a comfortable passage in the opening round against Keflavik, but Nantes provided stubborn opposition in Round 2.

Inevitably, as the competition moves towards the later rounds, the task becomes harder, and the tension mounts. The original entrants numbering 64 have now been reduced to 16, and every club engaged in the present Third Round now has an eye on a place in the Final.

The U.E.F.A. Cup is proving a great success in its first season, and with a place in the Quarter-finals as a prize for success in this round, we can anticipate an atmosphere tonight comparable with what we have known in other European competitions in the past.

The rest of the Third Round draw, published elsewhere in this programme, indicates the strength of the clubs left in the competition. The size of our own task is underlined by the performances of Rapid in the earlier rounds.

In Round 1 they defeated Napoli of Italy, and Legia of Warsaw were their victims in the last round.

To the supporters of Rapid we also extend a warm welcome. Whatever the result of the match, it is our hope that they will be rewarded for their long journey by a memorable display of top-class football.

AWAY GOALS

As away goals in the U.E.F.A. Cup competition have an extra value, it is highly important that we should prevent Rapid from scoring.

As tonight's match is the first leg, the duration is, of course, limited to 90 minutes whatever the score. It is after the second leg that the system of away goals counting double is brought into force if the scores are still level.

If this system fails to settle the tie, even after extra time, the winners are decided by a series of penalty kicks, taken alternately by the two teams.

The substitution of two players per team is permitted at any time during the game.

TONIGHT'S VISITORS

RAPID BUCAREST, which sprang from a railway workers' club, has been in existence since 1923. The club's ground is known as the Stadium Giulisti, but the second leg next Wednesday will be played at the "23rd August Stadium", the vast national arena, which is a popular venue for big matches in Rumania.

Rapid's average gate figure is 16,000. This is a good figure by Rumanian standards and is bettered only by the Dinamo Bucharest club.

Rapid were winners of the Rumanian League championship in season 1966-67 and have won the National Cup on seven occasions, the last being in 1942.

Here are details of the Rapid players:

RADUCANU NECULA, Goalkeeper. Joined Rapid in 1965. Has made 19 international appearances for Rumania. A World Cup player for Rumania in Mexico last year, and played against Wales last month. Aged 25.

ADRIAN RAMUREANU, Goalkeeper. The regular second choice, who has also gained international honours. Aged 25.

ION POP, Defender. Joined Rapid from Dinamo Pitesti in 1967. Has been honoured five times at Under-23 level, three times in Olympic teams and 12 times for the Rumanian Youth XI. Aged 24.

GHEORGHE CODREA, Left-back. Joined Rapid from University Craiova. Holds three youth caps. Aged 23.

ALEXANDRU BOC, Centre-back. Joined Rapid from Dinamo this year. Has 13 full international caps, has made five appearances in the Olympic team and has 19 Under-23 games to his credit. Aged 25.

NICHOLAE LUPESCU, Sweeper. Joined Rapid from a club in a lower division in 1962. Sixteen full caps and 10 each at Olympic and Under-23 level. Played for Rumania in the World Cup in Mexico, and headed their first goal against Wales last month. Good in the air and often moves up for corner-kicks. Aged 30.

CONSTANTIN MUSAT, Midfield. Joined Rapid in 1969. Has been selected twice for the Under-23 team. Aged 22.

CONSTANTIN DINU, Midfield. Has been with Rapid since he was 13. Has one full international cap, and has played five times for the Under-23s and four times at Olympic level. Aged 28.

ION DUMITRU, Midfield. One of Rumania's top players, he has appeared in 15 full internationals in addition to three Olympic games and seven Under-23 matches. Was in the team that beat Wales last month. Has been a Rapid player since he was 13. Is now 21.

IORDAN ANGHELESCU, Midfield. Joined Rapid from University Craiova in 1968. Has five Under-23 caps and 15 in Olympics. Aged 25.

CONSTANTIN NASTURESCU, Outside-right. Joined Rapid in 1961. Has six full international caps in addition to 10 Under-23 and five at Youth level. Aged 28.

MARIAN PETREANU, Outside-right. Another Rapid player who has been with the club since he was 13. Has 12 full caps and 20 at Youth level. Aged 21.

TEOFIL CODREANU, Outside-left. Has been a Rapid player since 1960. Has four international caps. Aged 30.

DANIEL ENE, Striker. Joined Rapid this year from Sports Club Bacau. Has five Under-23 caps. Aged 27.

ALEXANDRU NEAGU, Striker. Rapid's leading goalscorer. Has 14 full international caps and was with Rumania's World Cup squad in Mexico. Has played twice for the Olympic team and twice for the Youth team. A Rapid player since boyhood. Aged 23.

MR. MARIAN BAZIL, the Rapid coach, played for the club from 1947 to 1954. He then took a trainer's post with another club, but has since returned to Rapid. His duties correspond to those of the team manager in British football.

MR. EMIL DOBRESCU, a vice-president of Rapid who is in charge of the party tonight, also played for the club from 1923 until 1926.

Some idea of Rapid's current form will be gleaned from the Rumanian League table published elsewhere in this programme. The total number of League matches played in a season is 30.

FOOTBALL IN RUMANIA

By Jack Rollin

FOOTBALL has long played a prominent part in the sporting life of the Rumanians. And today the development of the game has reached a standing comparable with the best in Eastern Europe.

It was introduced into the country just before the turn of the century. British engineers working in the oilfields helped to establish the first club in Ploesti in 1905 and four years later a club championship was started. The initial one had just three clubs: Olimpia Bucharest, Colentina Bucharest and United Ploesti. English amateur teams like Bishop Auckland and Oxford City toured the country.

The first world war disrupted progress for a while but an entry was subsequently made in the 1924 Olympic tournament. Then in 1930, some months after the formation of the football federation, the Rumanians were one of only four European countries who sent a team to Montevideo for the first World Cup.

They participated in the 1934 and 1938 World Cup competitions, too, before the advent of another world war called a halt to proceedings. Before this period the majority of their international experience came from friendly and competitive matches in the Balkan Cup with their immediate neighbours; matches which produced varying success for Rumania.

With the setting up of the People's Republic after hostilities ceased the re-organisation of sport in general and football in particular improved amenities and raised the standard of play.

REGULAR ENTRIES

Rumania have supported the three major European club tournaments in the past decade and a half. Regular entries have been made in the European Cup (since 1956), Cup-Winners Cup (1961) and the Fairs Cup (1962).

In 1966-67 Petrolul Ploesti forced Liverpool to a play-off in the European Cup and it was the same club who had reached the quarter-final of the Fairs Cup in 1962-63 for Rumania's best performance in Europe.

The previous year had seen the country's finest achievement in international football when they were hosts for the 15th annual European youth tournament. The Rumanians revealed their administrative ability and the depth of interest for this well organised competition. A total of 400,000 spectators for 35 matches compared favourably with the earlier efforts of other countries.

In the final Rumania beat Yugoslavia 4—1; a result which more than compensated for the disappointment in 1960 when they had lost 2—1 to Hungary in Vienna at the same stage.

From this sound embryo basis the stature and performance of the national team blossomed as the younger players matured into it.

Rumania made their first post-war appearance in the World Cup Finals in 1970 and were drawn in the same group as England at Guadalajara. England only beat them 1—0 and it was the fourth time that the two countries had met at this level. Of the previous three meetings two had occurred in the immediate two years, resulting in 1—1 and 0—0 draws, while back in 1939 England had won 2—0 in Bucharest.

ONE SUCCESS

Of another four Under-23 matches between 1957 and 1964, England had won three to Rumania's one success gained by a single goal in Bucharest in June 1963.

The 16-club Rumanian First Division is keenly contested. There are 32 teams grouped in the Second Division and 128 in Division Three. The Rumanian Cup attracts an enormous entry of 3,500. There is a mid-winter break during the season which unfortunately has often had a detrimental effect on efforts in European competition.

With an accommodation of 70,000 the national stadium in Bucharest, named 23rd August after the date of the Republic's emergence, is the largest in the country and well appointed.

FOOTBALL IN RUMANIA—Continued

With the nucleus of the 1970 World Cup squad the Rumanians were still vitally concerned with the group stages of the current European Championships in November.

The status of the players falls into the usual Eastern European definition of non-amateurs. The top ones receive something like £150 a month including bonuses but, of course, have outside occupations, many of them in government jobs.

Not only do the Rumanians enjoy their football—they take it seriously as well and the leading clubs frequently go away during the week for special training.

Their football is technically well versed and individual skill has been happily blended with modern tactical requirements, making it both attractive and formidable.

MAN IN CHARGE

The referee this evening is Mr. Robert Schaut, a Belgian from Antwerp. Mr. Schaut, who is employed as a technical clerk in a big telephone company in Antwerp, has a big reputation on the Continent.

He started as a referee in 1953, and has been on the F.I.F.A. panel since 1964. He has controlled a number of international matches, and among his many other top engagements are several ties in the European Champions Cup and the European Cup-Winners' Cup.

Referee Schaut, who is married with two daughters, lives in the Berchem district of Antwerp.

The second leg of tonight's Cup-tie in Bucharest next week will be refereed by Signor Aurelio Angonese of Mestre, Italy, who controlled the second-leg tie of the Anglo-Italian League Cup-Winners' Cup between Spurs and Torino on this ground in September.

NOT THE FIRST . . .

Rapid Bucarest are not the first Rumanian team to perform here at White Hart Lane.

On a Tuesday evening in October, 1957, we staged a youth international between England and Rumania on this ground, and the match was watched by a crowd of 8,819.

Several of the England youth players that evening went on to make big names, and some of them are still performing regularly in League football.

It is interesting at this distance of time to look back on the events of that match. Derek Temple, then 18, opened the score for England with a goal executed with all the coolness of a veteran, and before half-time Micky Block cracked home a 30-yard free-kick that gave the Rumanian goalkeeper no chance.

It was Block who took the score to 3-0 in the second half following brilliant work by Jimmy Melia, now Aldershot's player-manager. Then Rumania stepped in for Mateianu, their centre-forward, to score from close range, and 10 minutes later they narrowed the margin with a second goal, scored in spectacular style by Motroc, their captain.

FURTHER ACTION

Rumania's rally stirred England to further action and towards the end Barry Bridges, the present Millwall player, scored a fourth goal to ensure victory for England.

"PARIS OF THE BALKANS"

Bucharest is the capital of Rumania, and its population of around 1.500,000 is the largest of any town in that country.

It stands almost halfway between the River Danube and the foothills of the Carpathian Mountains, and has been described as the "Paris of the Balkans".

It's a fair comparison. Treelined boulevards are an attractive feature of Bucharest, parks and gardens are plentiful and the city is noted for its acres

Bucharest is in the main a modern city. A disastrous fire in 1848 destroyed many of the old buildings, and in consequence there are few visible links with the past.

Rumania, bordered by Russia, Hungary, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia and the Black Sea, has had a long and turbulent history. It was in 1947 that the monarchy was finally dissolved, and the Rumanian People's Republic proclaimed.

These few facts are far removed from football, but we feel they may interest spectators this evening, and in particular that stalwart band of Spurs supporters who can be relied upon to turn up in Bucharest for the second leg next Wednesday.
