

### **FOREWORD**

L OOKING back over the events of last season, I find I have mixed feelings. It is an attitude which I am sure is shared by the Club's supporters.

We can all take pride in the achievement of the team in winning the Football League Cup and reaching the Semi-final of the U.E.F.A. Cup.

The performance of Spurs in those two Cup competitions would justify our claim to have tasted success in season 1972–73. At the same time we cannot blind ourselves to the fact that the Club finished in eighth position in the League.

That represented a drop of two places compared with our final position at the end of the previous season. The championship of the Football League is always our main target, but it cannot be achieved without a greater measure of consistency.

We are conscious of this failing, and know it is something that has to be worked upon. Our supporters are entitled to the maximum effort in every match.

We are, of course, entitled to reflect with satisfaction on our League Cup triumph. We became the first club to win this trophy twice, and again preserved our proud record of having won every major final in which we have played.

Details of our progress to the Final of the League Cup are to be found elsewhere in this handbook. We defeated Norwich City 1—0 in the Final at Wembley, Ralph Coates scoring the all-important goal, but it was not the classic we should have liked to witness.

Our task was made difficult by the defensive approach adopted by Norwich. As a spectacle the game certainly did not compare with that sparkling Fifth Round replay against Liverpool at White Hart Lane.

That was our outstanding match in the competition, Spurs emerging winners by 3—1 after the 1—1 draw at Anfield.

Supporters will hardly need reminding that Liverpool were to take ample revenge before the season ended by defeating us in the Semi-final of the U.E.F.A. Cup. We had lost 0—1 at Anfield in the first leg, but our 2—1 win in the second leg signalled our knock-out on the system of away goals counting double.

Liverpool went on to win the U.E.F.A. Cup which we held ourselves last season. Happily, we are again competing in the U.E.F.A. Cup this season on the strength of our League Cup triumph.

Our F.A. Cup run last season ended in the Fourth Round, Derby County defeating us 5—3 in extra time in the replayed match at White Hart Lane. Spurs were leading 3—1 during the second half, and the final result was therefore a bitter disappointment. Yet there was some consolation in the fact that it was a really splendid game of football.

Once again the Reserve team had a good season. For much of the campaign we were in the running for the championship, but our final position of runners-up was highly creditable in view of the number of young players fielded in Football Combination matches.

The Youth team were among the honours and congratulations are due to them for winning the championship of the South-East Counties League, Division 1, and also the London Youth Cup.

It has again been a source of pride to us that Spurs' players should have been in demand for international matches. Martin Chivers, Martin Peters, Mike England, Pat Jennings, Joe Kinnear and Steve Perryman have all added to their impressive record of international appearances.

It was also an honour for the Club that Pat Jennings should have been elected "Footballer of the Year" by the Football Writers' Association.

Pat was a very popular choice. He has proved himself an excellent ambassador for professional football both on and off the field, and we hope he will continue to enjoy further success in our ranks.

Pat gave many fine displays last season, and those of us who were fortunate enough to be present are never likely to forget his superb exhibition, including the saving of two penalties, in the away League match with Liverpool.

Alan Gilzean also deserves a special mention. He had a fine season and shared third place in the Football Writers' poll for the "Player of the Year".

Changes are inevitable in football, and a number of young players have left us this summer. Ray Clarke and Eddie Jones, both regular Combination players last season, have joined Swindon Town and Millwall respectively.

We have also lost the services of Roger Morgan, a member of our pool of senior players. Roger retired from the game on medical advice towards the end of last season following a history of knee trouble.

We wish each of these former players the best of luck in the future and thank them for their past services.

A few years ago the playing pitch at White Hart Lane came in for quite a lot of criticism. The surface certainly needed attention, and the Board of Directors enlisted the services of the Bingley Turf Research Institute, the leading specialists in this field.

With their advice, and the efforts of our own ground staff, our pitch problems are now a thing of the past, and we can pride ourselves on the high quality of our playing surface.

Ground improvements are always in our minds, and work has commenced on the linking-up of the West and South Stands, providing a further 700 seats. This project will be completed this season.

A new bar will be incorporated in the new extension, and additional turnstiles installed. We had also hoped to have a restaurant, on a membership basis, underneath the new ball-court and gymnasium at the north-west corner of the ground, in readiness for the opening of this season. Unfortunately, there has been some delay in granting planning permission.

Last season there was a departure from our past policy when a testimonial match was held in October for Jimmy Greaves.

Jimmy captained a full-strength Spurs team against Feyenoord, the Dutch club, and added to the nostalgia and emotion of the occasion by scoring the first goal in a manner reminiscent of many he had netted in his Tottenham heyday.

Once again it is my pleasant duty to thank everyone who supported the Club last season, especially those who travelled so many miles, on so many occasions, to matches both in this country and abroad.

A new season is a new chapter in the Club's history. I share the fervent hope of all our supporters that 1973-74 will be a season in which Spurs will have further cause for celebration.

### TOURNAMENTS JUNE 1973

THIS year Spurs' Youth team competed in tournaments staged by both the Feyenoord and Blauw-Wit clubs of Holland.

Our party left Liverpool Street Station on the evening of 30th May for Harwich, travelling by sea to the Hook of Holland. It was a good trip, but the weather was wet and cheerless on their arrival in Holland early the following morning.

On the first afternoon the players put in a spell of light training on the Feyenoord practice pitch in Rotterdam in preparation for the first match in Group 1 of the 14th Feyenoord International Tournament.

Spurs' first match, the second of the tournament, was against Feyenoord on that club's main pitch on the evening of 1st June. There was a marked age difference between our own and the opposing players, and the greater experience of the latter soon became evident.

Feyenoord took an early 2—0 lead, but Roger Gibbins reduced their advantage by scoring just before half-time. A third goal strengthened Feyenoord's position, but Danny Clapton scored a second goal for Spurs after good work by John Margerrison.

We were therefore defeated 2—3 in our first match. Spurs' team was: Cranstone; Gibbins, Anderson, Keeley, Cegielski, Clapton, McGrath, Margerrison, Mabee, Jones, C. and R. Scarth.

Continuous overnight rain caused a complete abandonment of the match programme scheduled for 2nd June. Fortunately, the weather changed late on the afternoon of that day, and sunshine and a good breeze helped to dry out the waterlogged pitch.

The re-organisation of the matches meant a hectic day on Sunday, 3rd June, when we were called upon to play three games.

At 10.30 hours on that day we lined up against Aarhus, the team we should have played the previous day. This time, with the same team that had played Feyenoord, we lost 1—3, and again we were handicapped by meeting an older and more experienced side.

Spurs conceded an early goal, and after Gary Mabee had equalised, Aarhus scored a second goal just before half-time. During the second half Ian Smith was brought on as substitute for Bobby Scarth. Smith took the place of Gibbins, who moved up to the forward line.

In the closing minutes a goalkeeping error enabled Aarhus to score a third goal.

Two hours after the start of the Aarhus match, we were on the field again facing N.A.C., Breda, a team whose senior XI had won the Dutch F.A. Cup a couple of days earlier.

We fielded the team that had finished the game against Aarhus, with Smith in defence and Gibbins in attack. Spurs started well, and took the lead when Mabee scored after a shot by Margerrison had been deflected.

Spurs then conceded a penalty for an infringement by Wayne Cegielski, and the score at half-time was 1—1. Early in the second half Clapton scored a good goal from 16 yards range, and close on time Mabee netted a third to give Spurs a 3—1 win.

As this match had been won by a two-goal margin, Spurs were in third position in Group 1 of the tournament. This meant a play-off against Anderlecht, who were third in the other group, and the match had to start within half an hour of the end of the game with N.A.C.!

Again we fielded an unchanged team, and Spurs gave a really good display. Unfortunately, we failed to turn a number of good openings to account, and an entertaining game, which Spurs should have won, ended in a goalless draw.

This meant that fifth and sixth placings in the tournament would have to be decided on a penalty contest, the kicks being taken alternately by five different players from each team.

Clapton missed Spurs' first, and Anderlecht scored. Chris McGrath failed, but again Anderlecht scored. Then the pattern changed. Gibbins scored and Anderlecht missed. Margerrison converted the next and Anderlecht also scored. Chris Jones then scored and Anderlecht missed. The score-sheet was therefore even with both teams failing twice from their allotted five kicks.

The stage was now set for the "sudden death" system. The first team to miss would be the losers, and the penalty takers were to be drawn from the players who had not already had a kick.

Four Spurs penalties failed to produce a goal, and it was not until their fourth attempt that Anderlecht managed to score. The winner was therefore netted with the 18th penalty kick, and the match ended on a note of farce.

Spurs finished sixth out of the eight clubs engaged in the two groups. All matches in this tournament were of 25 minutes duration each way.

From Rotterdam our party moved to the Hague on 4th June where a couple of days rest were spent, including a spot of sight-seeing.

On 6th June the party travelled by coach to the National Sports Centre at Papendal, near Arnhem. The two-year-old sports centre is extremely well appointed and afforded us excellent training facilities.

Two days later the party left for Amsterdam for the 37th Blauw-Wit Youth International Tournament, but felt they could not leave the Arnhem district without paying a visit to the paratroopers' cemetery as a mark of respect to those who gave their lives in one of the epic battles of the war.

Spurs were in Group "B" of the Blauw-Wit tournament, and on 9th June, we were again called upon to play three matches in one day.

At 10.00 hours the following team lined up against Go Ahead Eagles: Cranstone; Gibbins, Anderson, Keeley, Cegielski, Clapton, McGrath, Margerrison, Mabee, Jones, C. and R. Scarth.

Spurs produced a good standard of football, and Jones headed through in the 15th minute from a free-kick by Gibbins. In the second half McGrath volleyed home a back-header by Mabee, and Spurs were worthy winners by 2—0. In this match Noel Brotherston replaced McGrath for the last seven minutes.

At 13.00 hours it was our turn to play Leicester City, the only other English club in our group.

We fielded an unchanged team, but were beaten 2—0 by an experienced Leicester side, who scored a goal in each half. Towards the end of this match Smith came on as substitute for Scarth, Gibbins again moving up into an attacking position.

The third match of the day was at 15.15 hours against P.S.V. Eindhoven. It was a well-contested match, P.S.V. playing the best football they produced during the tournament.

After a goalless first half, Margerrison converted a penalty kick after Scarth had been brought down. Only two minutes later P.S.V. equalised, also from a spot-kick, awarded for alleged "hands". The match ended 1—1 and our team line-up was the same as against Leicester, Smith again substituting for Scarth at a late stage with Gibbins moving upfield.

Spurs' next engagement was against Jong Amsterdam at 10.00 on 10th June. Our team, facing what was possibly the most experienced side in the tournament, was: Cranstone; Smith, I., Anderson, Keeley, Cegielski, Clapton, McGrath, Margerrison, Mabee, Gibbins and Jones, C.

Spurs played well in this game but were a goal down after 10 minutes, and there was no further scoring. Ten minutes from time Ian Cranstone was injured. He struggled on gallantly to the end, and was then taken to hospital, where an X-ray revealed that he had broken a bone in his foot.

The only consolation for Ian was the presentation of an Omega gold watch, awarded to him as the "unluckiest player of the tournament". He was also presented with the ball used in the final match of the competition.

On the afternoon following our morning match against Jong, we played Ajax with the following team: Gibbins; Smith, I., Anderson, Keeley, Cegielski, Clapton, McGrath, Margerrison, Mabee, Jones, C. and R. Scarth.

We won this match 3-0, and any Spurs supporter would have been proud of our performance, which was rated the best of the tournament.

Jones opened the score after good work by Margerrison and McGrath, and just before half-time McGrath cracked in a first-timer for the second. Spurs continued to delight the large crowd in the second half, when our third goal was scored by Margerrison, who had played himself completely through to finish off a splendid move in great style. It was a goal to remember!

This win over Ajax gave Spurs second position in Group "B", which qualified us to play Blauw-Wit, the host club, in a play-off for third and fourth place. Blauw-Wit had finished second in Group "A".

We were represented by the team that had played Ajax, and after only two minutes McGrath gave Spurs the lead. An excellent goal by Scarth took Spurs' score to 2—0, and although we created some good chances in the second half, there were no more goals.

Spurs therefore finished in third position out of the 12 clubs

involved in the two groups. All matches in this tournament were 20 minutes each way with the exception of the play-off against Blauw-Wit, which was 30 minutes each way.

As stand-in for the last two matches for the injured Cranstone, Gibbins did exceptionally well as an emergency goalkeeper, but credit must also be given to the defenders for the sound protection they gave him.

The party left Amsterdam on 12th June, and although Spurs had not been as successful as on previous Youth trips to Holland, the team had given a good account of itself, and the comments of our hospitable Dutch hosts left the impression that the reputation of the Tottenham Hotspur club had been enhanced.

ANDERSON, Gary (defender). 5 ft. 81 in.

Has been a full professional since last December, and when last season ended had six Football Combination appearances to his credit, plus three as substitute. Born at Poplar, but later moved to Dagenham, where he attended the Erkenwald School. Played for Barking, London and Essex Boys, and joined Spurs as an apprentice in April, 1971.

BEAL, Philip (defender). 5 ft. 91 in.

Has the distinction of being the longest-serving player on Spurs' books. Born at Godstone in Surrey, and signed as an amateur in May, 1960. Became a full professional after a spell as an apprentice in January, 1962. Won County honours with Surrey Boys in his schooldays and Youth honours for England in season 1962–63. Made his League debut away to Aston Villa in September, 1963, Has had more than his fair share of injuries.

CEGIELSKI, Wayne (defender). 5 ft. 11 in.

Upgraded from apprentice to full professional rank just before the end of last season. Born at Blackwood in Monmouthshire, and played for the Tredegar Boys team before signing for Spurs as an apprentice in July 1972. Was a regular member of the Youth team last season, and was also given his chance in the Combination team.

CHIVERS, Martin (forward). 6 ft. 1 in.

A regular member of the England Team and one of the biggest names in football. Born at Southampton and played for the Southampton and Hampshire County Boys teams. Signed as a professional for the Southampton club, and made his League debut in the Second Division in season 1962-63. Transferred from Southampton to Spurs in January, 1968, and scored the winning goal in his debut on Sheffield Wednesday's ground a few days later. Scored 33 goals last season in League and Cup matches.





### CLAPTON, Daniel (forward). 5 ft. 101 in.

Born in Hackney and attended Morpeth School, Played in the East London, London, Middlesex and England Boys teams. Joined Spurs as an apprentice in May, 1970, and was upgraded to full professional in February, 1972. Has played regularly in the Youth team in each of the last two seasons, also making five Combination appearances in 1972–73. He is a nephew of the former England and Arsenal outside-right of the same name.



Scored the goal that won the Football League Cup for Spurs against Norwich City at Wembley last season while playing as substitute for John Pratt, who had withdrawn through injury. Joined Spurs from Burnley in May, 1971, and in his two seasons with the Club has made 61 Football League appearances, plus three as substitute. Born at Hetton-le-Hole, County Durham, and was playing as a striker for Eppleton Colliery Welfare Juniors before Burnley offered him a trial. Made eight appearances in the Under-23s, and has played four times for the full England team.





### COLLINS, Peter (defender). 6 ft. 1 in.

Could hardly have finished last season on a better note—scored in each of the last two League matches! Joined Spurs from Chelmsford City, the Southern League club, in January, 1968. Comes from Chelmsford, and attended the local Westlands Junior and Moulsham Secondary Schools. Spotted by Chelmsford while playing for Crompton Parkinson Youth team, and had previously played for Chelmsford Boys. Made his senior debut for Spurs against Glasgow Rangers in July, 1968, scoring two goals. His League debut, at home to Arsenal, followed 10 days later.



Stood in twice last season for Pat Jennings after making his League debut at home to West Bromwich Albion in the previous season. Born at Witham in Essex and still lives there. Played for Chelmsford, Mid-Essex and Essex County Boys before joining Spurs as an apprentice in July, 1968. Upgraded to full professional in September, 1969. Gained two England Youth caps in season 1969-70.





### DILLON, Michael (defender). 5 ft. 11 in.

Made his League debut for Spurs away to Manchester United last season and finished the campaign with 10 League and Cup appearances to his credit. Born at Highgate and attended Holloway School. A schoolboy international, he also played for Islington, London and Middlesex Boys. Became an apprentice with Spurs in May, 1968, and was upgraded to full professional in December, 1969. A former England Youth international.

### ENGLAND, Michael (defender). 6 ft. 11 in.

A regular and commanding figure in the Welsh international team. Born at Greenfield, near Holywell in North Wales, and was an inside-forward in his schooldays. Joined Blackburn Rovers as a 15-year-old ground-staff boy, and filled various positions before settling at centre-half with the Lancashire club. Transferred from Blackburn to Spurs in August, 1966, in time to make his debut in the opening match of the season at home to Leeds United. His full impressive record of international appearances is shown on page 74.

### EVANS, Raymond (defender). 5 ft. 91 in.

A local discovery from Edmonton. Played for Edmonton Boys' and attended Wilbury Way Primary and Huxley Secondary Modern Schools. Signed for Spurs as an apprentice professional in July, 1965, and became a full professional in May, 1967. Made several appearances for the England Youth team in season 1967–68. His debut in Spurs' League team was away to Arsenal in March, 1969.



Born in Enfield, where he attended the Ambrose Fleming School. Played for the Enfield, London and Middlesex Boys teams, and joined Spurs as an apprentice in May, 1971. Upgraded to full professional rank last December. Was a regular member of the Youth team last season, and also made four Combination appearances. Son of Eddie Gibbins, the former Spurs defender.





### GILZEAN, Alan (forward). 5 ft. 11 in.

Joined Spurs from Dundee in December, 1964. Comes from Coupar Angus in Perthshire, and was spotted by Dundee while playing for Coupar Angus Juveniles. Gained his first cap for Scotland against Norway in season 1962-63, and has since made many more appearances for his country. Made 56 appearances last season in the League and the three Cup competitions, plus one as substitute in the League Cup. Was named as joint third with Liverpool's Emlyn Hughes in last season's "Footballer of the Year" poll by the Football Writers' Association.



Born at Kilburn and attended the local Percy Secondary Modern School. Spotted while playing for the Brent District Boys Team. Signed as an apprentice in April, 1967, and became a full professional in February, 1969. Was contemporary in the Middlesex Boys team with Steve Perryman. A member of the England Youth team in season 1969–70, he made his League debut for Spurs as substitute away to Liverpool in December, 1971.





### JENNINGS, Patrick (goalkeeper). 5ft. 111 in.

An easy winner of the "Footballer of the Year" award last season, and also the "Player of the Year" rhoice in Norway. Born at Newry in Ulster and spent half a season with the Newry Town club. Selection for the Irish Youth team in a tournament at Bognor Regis brought him to the notice of Watford. Signed for Watford and moved from the Hertfordshire club to Spurs in June, 1964. Won his first full cap for Northern Ireland against Wales at Swansea in April, 1964, when only 18. Has now been an automatic selection for his country for a number of years. Missed only two first-team matches last season.

### JONES, Chris (forward). 5 ft. 10} in.

Born in Jersey, and established himself in schools football in the Channel Islands. Signed for Spurs as an apprentice in May, 1971, and was upgraded to full professional status at the end of last season. Made 16 appearances in the Combination team last season and scored seven goals. Also netted three goals in the London Challenge Cup.



### KINNEAR, Joseph (defender). 5 ft. 7½ in.

Born in Dublin, but lived in Watford from the age of seven. Joined Spurs as an amateur in August, 1963, after playing for St. Albans City, and signed as a professional in February, 1965. Made his League debut at home to West Ham United in April, 1966. Gained his first full cap for Eire against Turkey in season 1966-67, and has since made several more international appearances. Missed the closing matches of last season through injury. Has property interests.

### KNOWLES, Cyril (defender). 6 ft. 0 in.

Comes from Fitzwilliam, three miles from Pontefract in Yorkshire. After playing for the South Elmsall District Boys' team, he spent a season with Manchester United, but returned home to play for the local Hemsworth club. Then had a spell in Wolverhampton Wanderers' nursery before turning professional with Middlesbrough. Transferred from Middlesbrough to Spurs in May, 1964. A full English international who has also played for the Under-23s and the Football League. His debut for Spurs was at home to Sheffield United in August, 1964.



### LEE, Terry (goalkeeper). 5 ft. 11 in.

Born at Stepney but emigrated to New Zealand in 1864. Played at inside-forward for North Island versus South Island in a schoolboy international trial while living in the Auckland district. Returned to Essex, and signed for Spurs as an apprentice in Applil, 1968, after making impact in the goalkeeping position with Havering and Essex Boys. Has been a full professional since May, 1970. Made 22 Combination appearances last season.



Born at Oxford, where he attended the Redefield School. Played for both Oxford and Oxfordshire County Boys teams before signing as an apprentice for Spurs in July, 1970. Became a full professional in February, 1972. Made 12 Combination appearances last season, and his total of South East Counties League, Division 1 goals in 1972-73 was 21.





### MARGERRISON, John (midfield). 5ft. 10 in.

Born at Boreham Wood, where he attended the Holmshill Secondary Modern School. Played for Boreham Wood and Hertfordshire Boys' teams, and was an England Schools trialist. Signed apprentice forms for Spurs in April, 1971, and was upgraded to full professional last December. Made nine appearances in the Combination team last season.



Comes from Belfast, where he attended the Dunlambert Secondary School. Captained the South Belfast and Northern Ireland Boys' teams. Joined Spurs as an apprentice in July, 1970, and was upgraded to full professional status in January, 1972. Last season he made 20 appearances in the Combination team.





### NAYLOR, Terence (defender). 5 ft. 10 in.

Had the cruel luck to fracture his right leg in the away League match with Crystal Palace last season, but was playing again before the campaign ended. Signed full professional forms for Spurs in November, 1968, having joined the Club as an apprentice in April, 1966. Was a member of our Football League Cup-winning team against Aston Villa in 1971. Made six League appearances last season, plus one as substitute. Also played as substitute in one League Cup and one U.E.F.A. Cup match.





### OSGOOD, Keith (defender). 5 ft. 11 in.

Made three appearances for the England Youth team last season, and played in the Little World Cup tournament in Italy this summer. Born at Isleworth and attended Syon School. Gained schoolboy international honours and also played for London and Hounslow Boys. Signed for Spurs as an apprentice in June, 1971, and was upgraded to full professional in June, 1972. Made 23 Combination appearances last season.

### PEARCE, James (forward). 5 ft. 9 in.

A local Tottenham boy, who made his mark in schools football, and played in the England Boys' team. Joined Spurs as an apprentice in May, 1963, and became a full professional in May, 1965. Made his League debut at home to Arsenal on the opening day of season 1968–69. Last season in League and Cup matches he made 44 full appearances and 14 as substitute.





### PECK, Joseph (defender). 6 ft. 11 in.

Born at Islington and played in the same Islington Boys team as Mike Dillon, Gained representative honours with the London and Home Counties Schools teams. Played as an amateur for Spurs until August, 1970, when he signed professional forms. Has been a regular member of the Combination team in each of the last two seasons.



The Club Vice-captain. Played in each of the three England Under-23 tour matches this summer and in all has made seven appearances for his country at that level. Born at Ealing and played for Middlesex, London and England Boys. Joined Spurs as an apprentice in July, 1967, and was upgraded to full professional in January, 1969. Made his League debut against Sunderland in September, 1969, and has missed only four League matches in the last three seasons. A former England Youth international.





### PETERS, Martin (midfield). 5 ft. 111 in.

The Club Captain and a regular member of the England international squad. Joined Spurs from West Ham United in March, 1970. Born at Plaistow but attended Fanshawe School in Dagenham, and played for Dagenham Boys. Graduated to schoolboy international rank, and also played for London and Essex. Made his League debut for West Ham in 1962, and his first appearance for Spurs in the home match with Coventry City a few days after his transfer. Has captained England, and his impressive record of international appearances is given on page 76. Scored 24 League and Cun goals for Spurs last season.

### PRATT, John (midfield). 5 ft. 72 in.

Had the bad luck to sustain an injury in the first half of the League Cup Final, and had to withdraw. Born at Hackney and attended Clark's College, Enfield. Played for the London F.A. Boys' team, and spent a year in Brentford's Youth side. Joined Spurs as an amateur following a recommendation by Terry Medwin, our former winger. Signed as a full professional in November, 1965, and made his League debut away to Arsenal in March, 1969. Keen on both cricket and table tennis.



















#### TOTTENHAM HOT-SPOTS

- 1882 Club formed by boys from a local cricket club and from the local Grammar School. The name of "Hotspur F.C." was adopted.
- 1883 Club reorganised under the presidency of Mr. John Ripsher. Club colours—navy blue. Matches played on Tottenham Marshes.
- 1885 First competitive match versus St. Albans in the London Association Cup, Spurs winning 5—2. Colours changed to light blue and white halves. First credit balance—9s.
- 1886 First cup final. Played Caledonians in the East End Cup and lost 1—0. Club re-named "Tottenham Hotspur Athletic Club".
- 1887 First meeting with Arsenal—then Royal Arsenal. Match abandoned 15 minues from time "owing to darkness", with Spurs leading 2—1.
- 1888 Spurs move to private ground in Northumberland Park, where the first admission charge of 3d. was made.
- 1890 Colours changed to red shirts and navy blue shorts.
- 1895 Spurs adopt professionalism.
- 1896 A record crowd of 6,000 spectators watch the friendly match against Aston Villa. Spurs elected to the Southern League, Division 1, and finish in fourth place. Club colours changed to chocolate and gold.
- 1898 The Club becomes a limited company and a match against Woolwich Arsenal attracts a record crowd of 14,000 spectators.
- 1899 Final change of colours to the now familiar white shirts and blue shorts.

  The Club moves to present site, originally a market garden. Accommodation for 35,000. Ground almost named as "Gilpin Park" but instead gradually became known as "White Hart Lane". First match staged was a friendly versus Notts County—gross receipts £115.

- 1900 Success at last—Spurs become champions of the Southern League.
- 1901 Spurs win the F.A. Challenge Cup to become the only non-League club, following the formation of the Football League in 1888, ever to achieve this honour.
- 1908 Entry secured to the Second Division of the Football League.
- 1909 Promotion to Division 1 gained at first attempt.
- 1915 Relegation to Division 2.
- 1920 Promoted again at first attempt, this time with a still unsurpassed Second Division record of 70 points.
- 1921 Second F.A. Cup triumph, Spurs beating Wolverhampton Wanderers by 1—0 at Stamford Bridge.
- 1928 Relegation to Second Division with 38 points.
- 1933 Promotion again, this time as Division 2 runners-up.
- 1934 New East Stand completed.
- 1935 Relegation to Second Division.
- 1938 The existing crowd record of 75,038 spectators was established for the visit of Sunderland in the Sixth Round of the F.A. Cup.
- 1950 Promotion to Division 1.
- 1951 Football League champions for the first time.
- 1959 Ted Ditchburn completes 452 League and F.A. Cup appearances, a Club record, between 1946 and 1959.
- 1961 Football League champions and winners of the F.A. Cup. The first club to complete the "double" since Preston North End and Aston Villa did so in 1889 and 1897 respectively.
- 1962 Winners again of the F.A Cup.
- 1963 Winners of the European Cup-Winners' Cup. The first British club to win a major European competition. Jimmy Greaves becomes Spurs' highest League goalscorer in one season with 37 goals.
- 1967 F.A. Cup-Winners for the fifth time.
- 1971 Winners of the Football League Cup.
- 1972 First winners of new U.E.F.A. Cup and first British club to win two major European trophies. Receipts of £48,360 at U.E.F.A. Final (home leg) is club record.
- 1973 Winners of the Football League Cup, the first club to have won the trophy twice.


