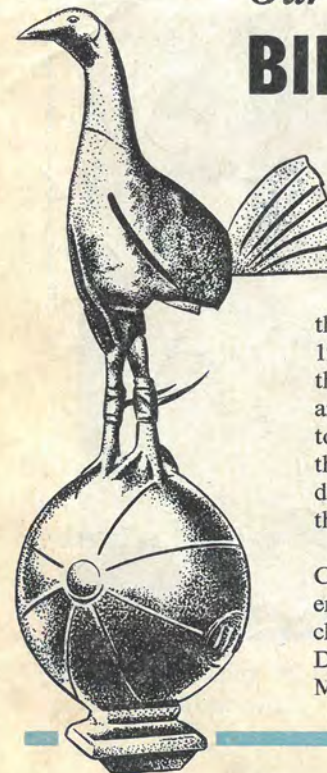
Our Visitors tonight

BIRMINGHAM CITY

THIS evening we give a cordial welcome to our visitors, Birmingham City, whom we meet in a Third Round replay in the F.A. Cup, after a stirring match last Saturday at St. Andrew's which was drawn at three goals each.

It is something of a coincidence that in all our Cup clashes with Birmingham City over the years, replays have been necessary. Back in 1905-06 in the Third Round (now corresponding to the Fifth) our match at Tottenham was drawn 1-1, and we lost the replay 0-2. In season 1952-53 it took three matches to decide the result of a tie in the Sixth Round; at Birmingham we drew 1-1, drew the replay at Tottenham 3-3, and won the third match, at Molineux, by 1 goal to nil.

Previously this season, on December 9th, we met City here in the League, when a well-contested game ended in a win for us by 3 goals to 1. We had two changes in our team last Saturday from that of December 9th, Greaves being at inside-left and Mackay being at left-half in place of Tony Marchi.

Birmingham, however, fielded the same team, with their inside-forward Jimmy Bloomfield still on the injured list.

In goal, John Schofield is back to his best form, having made a full recovery from an injury received last season when playing against Manchester United. At right-back Stan Lynn, signed from Aston Villa on October 20th of last year, has been a tower of strength in the defence, and he is partnered by Graham Sissons at left-back, Sissons having taken over that position after a period as understudy to Trevor Smith at centre-half. Smith, England International, has on either flank two of the younger players in the Birmingham side who are showing great promise—Terry Hennessey and Malcolm Beard. Mike Hellowell at outside-right was signed from Queen's Park Rangers, and at inside-right Brian Orritt is an "Under-23" International for Wales. On the opposite flank are two full Internationals in Ken Leek (Wales) and Bertie Auld (Scotland), with Jimmy Harris at centre-forward. Harris, who joined the City in December 1960 from Everton, is their leading marksman, and it will be recalled that he scored two of his side's goals last Saturday, with Ken Leek scoring the third.

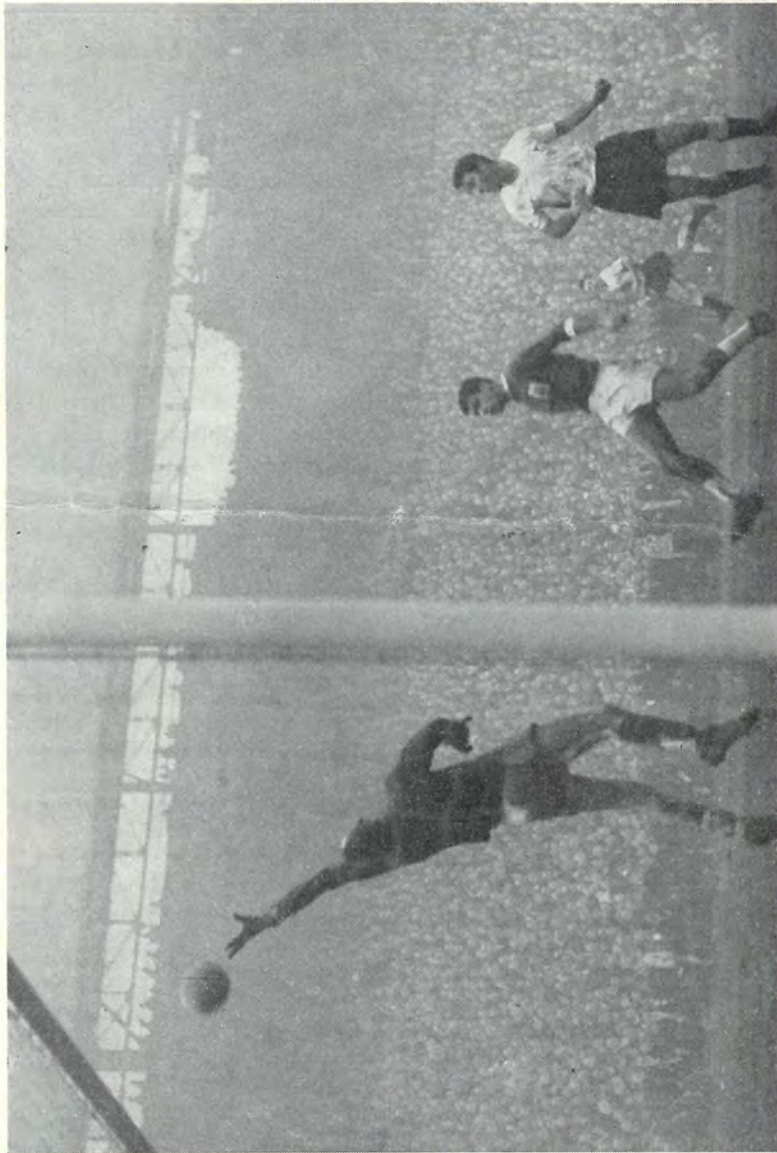
In the event of the scores being level after 90 minutes' play this evening, extra time of 15 minutes each way will be played.

LAST SATURDAY'S CUP-TIES

The wintry conditions prevailing in the early part of the week prevented eight of the 32 Cup ties being played in the Third Round last Saturday, and of the matches played eight were drawn, leaving 16 clubs assured of entry into the Fourth Round. Of these nine are from Division I, four from Division II, two from the Third Division, with Southern-Leaguers Weymouth carrying the standard of the non-League clubs into the next Round as a result of their victory at Morecambe. Of the London clubs, Arsenal, Charlton and Fulham are through, with Brentford and Leyton Orient having drawn and replayed last Monday, and our own tie being subject to replay to-night. London clubs, all drawn away from home, who were defeated were West Ham (at Plymouth), Chelsea (at Liverpool), Crystal Palace (at Aston Villa) and Queen's Park Rangers (at Burnley).

It is a tribute to the Birmingham ground staff that the playing pitch was in such good order for last Saturday's match, after it had been covered with snow for the greater part of the week. The match provided one of the most thrilling games seen at St. Andrew's in recent years, with the home side pulling up from a three-goal deficit to finish up on level terms.

After five minutes' play Ron

Henry headed over the bar a header from Leek, and this was an augury of some of the excitement to follow. Only three minutes later, however, Jimmy Greaves, taking a pass from Maurice Norman, had his first shot parried by Schofield at full length, but pounced on the ball to place it in the net, and give us an early lead. Our next goal came in the 30th minute when Cliff Jones raced on to a cross from Terry Medwin, out on the left wing, and two minutes later Greaves put us three ahead when he headed home a centre from Les Allen.

In the 33rd minute Birmingham struck back when a mighty free-kick taken by Lynn rebounded from a packed defence with Harris at hand to drive the ball home, and with three goals having been scored in as many minutes we led 3—1 at the interval. Five minutes after the resumption the Birmingham centre-forward, Harris, further reduced the arrears when he headed home a corner from Auld, and in the 55th minute came another powerful free-kick from Lynn which Bill Brown could only partially clear, and this time Leek was on the spot to level the scores, amid scenes of great excitement. This completed the scoring in a memorable Cup tie, and although both sides were to get the ball in the net (Leek for Birmingham and Greaves for Spurs) both were ruled offside.

At Colchester last Saturday our Reserves, after two setbacks in consecutive weeks, found their winning form again to win by 4 goals to nil, thereby increasing their lead in the Combination table to three points over nearest rivals West Ham. Our scorers were Clayton, Smith (R.) (2), and Dyson. Our team was: Hollowbread; Barton and Tharme; Smith (J.), Smith (A.) and Marchi; Aitchison, Collins, Smith (R.), Clayton and Dyson.

Next Saturday we have a dual encounter with Cardiff City. In the League we shall be the visitors at Ninian Park, and at Tottenham we receive their Reserves in the Football Combination.

OUR PORTRAIT GALLERY**LES ALLEN**

Les Allen was born at Dagenham, and played his early football for Briggs Sports with whom he was employed as an apprentice motor body builder. In season 1953-54 he helped Briggs to reach the Semi-Final of the Amateur Cup.

In September, 1954 Les signed as professional for Chelsea, and in December, 1959, he crossed over to join us from Stamford Bridge in exchange for Johnny Brooks, making his debut in our League side on December 19th against Newcastle United.

In his two years with us Les has made 89 appearances (77 in the League and 12 in the Cup) and has scored 51 goals to date (39 League and 12 in Cup-Ties). His best goalscoring performance in an individual match was his contribution of five in a replayed Cup-Tie with Crewe Alexandra in 1959-60 which we won 13-2.

As a reminder of the promising years that lie ahead for him was his selection for an England "Under 23" International with Wales at Goodison Park last season.
